## Guidelines for the Middle of the Course

From 10/18 until 10/25, classes will proceed in a new format. I will not lead the class sessions. Instead, you, the students, will lead the classes, as members of teams. We will use the reading guide questions to structure the class discussion. For each class, I will distribute a class plan. The class plan will contain an order of questions for discussion, selected from the reading guides. I will assign one team to each question. While every one should be prepared to discuss all the questions indicated in the class outline, every member of the team assigned to the question should be prepared to start the discussion.

After 10/25, as we start presentations, the teams may still play a significant role, depending on how it all goes.
Each person is assigned to one of three teams, as follows:
